

PHILIPPINE CONSULATE GENERAL, SHANGHAI

REQUIREMENTS FOR PETS ENTERING THE PHILIPPINES

1. Secure a Health Certificate issued by a duly licensed veterinarian or the Shanghai Inspection and Quarantine Bureau (Pujiang Station or International Airport Station) dated not more than 30 days before arrival in the Philippines. It should certify that the animal is free from, and has not been recently exposed to, any dangerous communicable disease, and that it has been given anti-rabies and other required inoculations.
2. Have the Health Certificate notarized by a Shanghai Notary Public (who will translate the document into English) and then have these documents authenticated by the Shanghai Foreign Affairs Office.
3. Present the Health Certificate for Certification of Authenticity to the Philippine Consulate General two weeks (2) weeks before shipment.
4. Secure an Import Permit by either of the following ways:

The Import Permit may be filed by any party in Manila in behalf of

the owner/importer provided that the fee of around P200.00 (US\$ 4.00 approx.) is paid and the particulars of the pet (kind, breed, age, etc.) are known to the filer. A copy of the import permit should be faxed to the owner/importer. It should be presented at the airport upon the arrival of the pet. OR

- b. Upon arrival at the airport in Manila by presenting the certified health certificate (refer to nos. 1 & 2 above) to the Quarantine Officer on duty, filing of the required import permit and the payment of the corresponding fee.
